# IT'S A LANDSLIDE!!

### 85.5% SAY NO TO SAINSBURY'S



The results of a historic referendum to discover whether residents want a proposed Sainsbury's store were announced outside the site in question today, Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June.

In front of a big crowd of residents, the cameras of the BBC and the local press, David Rossiter of the WHAG announced the results as given by the Electoral Reform Society who organised the postal ballot.

A tremendous roar of approval went up as it became clear that the **Vote NO campaign** had won by a landslide. David Rossiter commented: "Two weeks ago, after saying they wouldn't take part in this referendum, Sainsbury's wrote to virtually everyone in the polling area describing protesters as a "vocal minority". Today's result makes it quite clear they are the overwhelmingly vocal *majority* and so I'd put this question to Justin King, CEO of Sainsbury's board:

"How long will you try to ignore the unequivocal opposition of local residents before you decide to think again about this ill-conceived and unwanted development?" **Zac Goldsmith and Susan Kramer MP** both spoke to the crowd and to the BBC, hailing the win as a powerful message to Sainsbury's, and a significant moment in the battle to hand local democracy back to local people. Sir Tim Rice, who was unable to be present, sent a message of congratulations to all concerned saying he "hoped that Sainsbury's would now see reason and bow to the wishes of local people."

#### THE RESULT:

7,721 local people in the immediate area were sent ballot papers and the results are as follows:

votes cast: 4756

Number of ballot papers spoiled: 7 Votes in favour of the Sainsbury's

store: 687

Votes against the Sainsbury's store:4,062

Percentage for:14.5 —Percentage against 85.5

At 61.6% the turnout for this ballot is higher than for the last general election and nearly twice as high as in the 2006 local elections

Such a landslide victory for the WHAG and its supporters ought to jolt Sainsbury's out of their complacent "hey, we're the good guys here, honest" attitude and get them seriously thinking about a way out of the PR hole they've blindly staggered into.

And if we can, we should help them.

They do have a generally good reputation in locations where they are wanted and needed.

They simply had a rush of blood to the head here and once cooler management heads sit down and start thinking about repairing the damage, they could yet come out of this with some pride and even kudos.

In the meantime, they simply have to accept that the referendum result is unequivocal in its message: their store is not wanted here. Except by a tiny minority.

This is local democracy at work, Justin.

Ignore it at your peril.




