Just in case you missed the story so far here's some background for newcomers -

Sainsbury's is planning to open a new supermarket at the top of White Hart Lane on the site of the old garage showroom. This is part of a major development that will

include 9 new flats, as well as the supermarket. Planning permission was refused by Richmond Council but the developers, Oakmill Properties, won an appeal against the Council's decision. So, the supermarket will come unless public pressure persuades

Sainsbury's to change it's mind. And that is precisely what the White Hart Action Group (WHAG) is campaigning for. WHAG was set up and is run by local residents to make our voices heard.



Referendum

The big news this week is that Richmond Council has refused to conduct the referendum, proposed by Zac Goldsmith at last month's packed public meeting. Of course, a referendum would send a very strong message to Sainsbury's and so it WILL go ahead, but will be organised by the Electoral Reform Society, a long-established and totally impartial body. Look out for more news on this key development next week.
